

2. A CASE 1 - CIVIC GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT 1982 - PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE

Prior to the merits of the following item of business being considered by committee the Chair ruled that further representations that had been received late from applicant would be taken into consideration. The council's Solicitor had no objection to the further representations being tabled

The committee was then invited to consider a report (copies of which had been circulated) by the Chief Solicitor advising that Police Scotland and the council's Environmental Health Service had submitted representations.

The report recommended that should committee be minded to grant the application it do so subject to those conditions submitted by Police Scotland and the council's Environmental Health Service.

The applicant was given the opportunity to question the council's Solicitor, Police Scotland and the council's Environmental Health Officers.

The committee had an opportunity to question the council's Solicitor, Police Scotland and the council's Environmental Health Officers.

The committee heard the applicant speak in relation to the report who advised that they were happy to comply with all the conditions being proposed by Police Scotland but were encountering a number of difficulties with some of the conditions being proposed by Environmental Health Services.

The council's Solicitor and Police Scotland were given the opportunity to question the applicant.

The committee then had an opportunity to question the applicant.

Finally, each side summed up before the committee deliberated the merits of the case.

The committee then agreed to a thirty minute adjournment whilst the applicant and the council's Environmental Health Services reviewed the proposed conditions with a view to reaching a resolution that would be satisfactory to all parties.

Following the adjournment a revised set of conditions were tabled at the meeting and it was noted that these revised conditions had been agreed by all parties.

Decision

To grant the application for a Temporary Public Entertainment Licence subject to the Standard Conditions, those conditions prepared by Police Scotland and those revised conditions prepared by the council's Environmental Health Services.
