## 4. <u>CIVIC GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT 1982 - PRIVATE HIRE CAR</u> DRIVER'S LICENCE - ITEM 6

Introductions were made by all parties.

The applicant was in attendance and unrepresented and confirmed he was content to continue without representation.

Police Scotland was represented by Inspector Keith Mailer.

The applicant confirmed he had no dispute with the contents of the report or Police Scotland's letter.

The Chair asked the applicant if he felt he would need an interpreter.

The applicant confirmed he would not require an interpreter.

The Chair explained the procedure and the applicant confirmed he understood.

The Clerk referred the Committee to the report.

The Committee then heard Inspector Mailer speak in relation to the objection to the application submitted by Police Scotland.

The applicant was given an opportunity to question Inspector Mailer.

The committee had an opportunity to question Inspector Mailer.
