#### **D1 Terms of Report**

To report on activity for period 1 November 2019 – 31 January 2020.

#### D2 Grounds Maintenance Routine Works

Hedge cutting operations were completed during November and December. The annual maintenance visit to shrub beds in the ward is scheduled to start around the first week in March.

As part of the commitment to minimise the use of Glyphosate used, we are now recording the amount used in each ward. 140 litres were applied in the Linlithgow ward during 2019. This includes shrub beds, grass edges, hard landscaped areas and road channels.

The most recent LAMs score for the West area was 50, which remains less than the target of 67. This is likely to be due to the shrub beds not having been cleaned out when the areas were inspected.

### **Environmental Community Action**

Staff are continuing to deal with enquiries and carry out routine works to empty litter/dog waste bins, lift litter on footpaths, roads and open spaces throughout the ward with the NETs team dealing with fly tipping enquiries.

Over the period of the report resources continue to be directed towards dealing with leaf fall throughout West Lothian.

The team consists of one Senior Enforcement Officer and three Education/ Engagement Officers. The Senior Enforcement Officers post has been filled as of 6<sup>th</sup> January 2020 by Solomon Ede.

The Cleaner Communities Environmental team have dealt with various environmental enquiries relating to enforcement, education and engagement during the period.

Abandoned/Nuisance vehicle enquiries have been received and where required vehicles have been removed from streets by gaining compliance following negotiation, verbal warnings, warning letters, official notices served, or WLC contractor removal.

Officers dealt with fly tipping reports received across the ward with 18 reports dealt with in this reporting period which is an increase on the comparable period last year.

The total number of fly tipping enquiries for the year for the ward has shown an increase from 2015 with the exception of a slight dip in 2017. The wider picture does show a steady increase over the last five years for fly tipping throughout West Lothian.

The Education Officers supported Community Clean Up events throughout West Lothian by supplying equipment and removal of waste. We are already receiving bookings for 2020 from various groups and schools.

Officers continue to attend local meetings and follow up and report back on any issues raised.

## **Springfield Trees – Ownership and Future Maintenance**

Having established that the council doesn't own all the tree belts with the Springfield area, the residents who had made enquiries to the council regarding the removal of trees in areas where it was determined that the trees belonged to "Residents in Common"; were informed that they had the right, with the agreement of neighbours, to have the trees safely pruned or felled at their own expense.

The residents were also informed that the council would continue to maintain the trees and areas of open space on land owned by "Residents in Common" on an informal basis provided there were no fundamental changes to land use or significant felling without the council's permission.

Subsequently, a number of residents arranged for trees impacting on their own properties to be felled and removed, including a large area of felling. The trees were removed without the council's permission and without residents communicating with their wider neighbours. This has resulted in the council receiving further enquiries from other residents seeking clarification on the future maintenance responsibilities for the tree belts and areas of public open space.

The council is currently considering whether a Tree Protection Order is required to protect the interest of important trees in the future. A comprehensive survey of the tree belts is currently being undertaken by officers to determine the requirement for Tree Protection Orders.

On conclusion of the survey a public meeting will be arranged with local residents to discuss the options for the future maintenance of the trees and areas of public open space on land owned by the "Residents in Common".

# **Beecraigs Woodland Management**

Replanting of felled and windblown areas continues with assistance from various volunteer groups including the West Lothian 50+ group to celebrate the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the group and others of their network including the Armadale Youth Choir and a team from Oracle organised by Transition Linlithgow.

### **Tree and Woodland**

At present we are in the process of putting together a contract to enable a project for street tree replacement and enhancement within Linlithgow. The project is being financed through the Village Improvement Fund. This project is being led by members of Burgh Beautiful and with the assistance of our Procurement Services colleagues we should have a consultant in place to advise/facilitate in the near future.

The Ranger Service has been carrying out detailed condition surveys on all claimed rights of way throughout West Lothian, including routes between Torphichen and Linlithgow (LW163 LW164 LW166), and one near Beecraigs Country Park (LW127).

Ranger Service also surveyed the condition of LW165, a right of way northwest of Cockleroy Hill, LW172-175, that run from Kingscavil to Beecraigs Country Park and 187 on the outskirts of Winchburgh.

A recce was undertaken from Linlithgow along the Union Canal and River Avon Heritage Trail, planning the route for a free guided walk in July. This will be one of several district-wide ranger-led public walks this year in order to engage people with the outdoors and celebrate the Year of Coasts & Waters 2020.

Beecraigs Orange, the 6.8km waymarked route around the park, was patrolled, identifying maintenance issues and missing waymarkers, cutting back encroaching spruce and beech from the forest paths, and undertaking public engagement along the way.

Beecraigs Green was also patrolled clearing a couple of small trees that had come down over the path, cutting back encroaching bramble and carrying out maintenance on gate hinges.

Beecraigs are hosting the first round of the Scottish Cycling Mountain Bike Cross Country Race (SXC). The Ranger Service are working with the mountain bike volunteers to make sure the trails are robust enough to withstand 300 mountain bikers racing on it. The volunteers were out for three sessions in January.

Lothian Conservation Volunteers carried out fantastic work upgrading an extremely muddy section of the purple waymarked route in Beecraigs Country Park.

An enquiry was received about the lack of blue/green algae signage around the Loch. A Ranger checked and all signs are still up and visible at all entrances to the lochside areas.

## D6 Open Space and Cemeteries

## **Open Space Routine Works**

Lady Park Footpath, Linlithgow Loch. Property Services will submit a report to Council Executive in February 2020 seeking approval for a statutory acquisition of the land required. If successful an application will subsequently be made to Scottish Government.

Water Yett, Linlithgow Loch. Four trees lost in 2018 to storm damage have been replaced.

Rosemount Park, Linlithgow. Eight trees lost over the years to storm damage have been replaced. The trees and locations have been selected in discussion with Burgh Beautiful. The council will continue to work with Burgh Beautiful to make Rosemount Park a representative tree collection, and arboretum.
