The licence holder was in attendance.

The committee considered a report (copies of which had been circulated) by the Chief Solicitor inviting them to consider a request from Police Scotland for suspension or revocation of the private hire car driver's licence.

It was recommended that the committee determine whether to suspend or revoke the private hire car driver's licence, and if so, on what ground(s) and in the case of suspension to decide on the duration of suspension and if the licence should be suspended immediately.
