#### 1. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

<u>Item 5 - National Mental Health and Wellbeing Strategy Consultation Response</u>

#### CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE: ROOTS PROJECT

The panel considered a report (copies of which had been circulated) by the Head of Head of Social Policy providing an overview of the mental health landscape in West Lothian for children, young people and families. The report also included information on the Roots Partnership offered within the mental health framework.

Two presentations accompanied the report, the first of which covered the Mental Health and Wellbeing Services Roots Partnership. Information was provided on The Children and Young People's Mental Health Taskforce with an overview of the Services and Supports framework. Also detailed within the presentation was information on; both national and local drivers for change to mental health and wellbeing services, the local picture in West Lothian, response and developments, the Inclusion and Support Service (ISS) delivery model, ISS within Social Policy and the planned next steps.

Simon McGowan, from Children 1<sup>st</sup>, provided the second presentation which included further information on the Roots Partnership. Simon detailed the background of the Partnership and their approach before advising the panel of the organisations the Roots Partnership were involved, their links within West Lothian, the benefits of the Partnership and how Roots could be accessed.

It was recommended that the panel note that:

1. there were a number of services and supports in place to support the mental health and wellbeing of our children and young people as part of core services within both Social Policy and Education and in collaboration with Third Sector partners; and DATA LABEL: Public

2. that services were working together to ensure that the most appropriate mental health support was provided for children, young people and their families.
